Explanatory Note

The effect of the above proposals would be that the class in the learning resource centre for 15 pupils with moderate learning difficulties (MLD) at Pil Primary School would close on 1 September 2016.

Within the West locality there are three moderate learning difficulties learning resource centres namely Pil, Corneli and Cefn Cribwr.

The published admission number for Pil Primary School is 30. The published admission number for a school is the minimum number of pupils in the "relevant age group" (i.e. the age group to which children are normally admitted) that the school would be required to admit on demand. More children than this number can be admitted to the school (subject to the provisions of the Authority's admissions policy) if the Authority considers that there is sufficient accommodation available at the particular time, and provided that to do so would not prejudice the efficient use of education resources.
