Background

Since the introduction of austerity measures funding for services provided by local authorities across Wales has been reduced significantly. Over the next 4 years it is projected that Bridgend County Borough Council must make further savings totalling £36.4m. Very difficult decisions must therefore be taken by the council due to the levels of budget cuts required in respect of the provision of:

- outdoor sports facilities and parks sports pavilions
- maintained parkland and grass cut areas
- children's playgrounds and play areas

Within this questionnaire there are three sections available for you to complete on each of the above.

Your views will help the Council to make decisions about the future of playgrounds and play areas, maintained parkland and grass cutting and outdoor sports facilities, parks and sports pavilions.

Play area review

The council provides and maintains 108 children's play areas that have fixed play equipment such as swings, slides, roundabouts, rockers, climbing frames across the county borough. In addition the council invests sums of capital funding replacing old, damaged, and vandalised play equipment.

While some of these play areas are well used, others are less used and regularly suffer from vandalism and instances of anti-social behaviour. The council is considering a review of the number of children's play areas provided and how these facilities are maintained and managed. This could include improving some play areas and reducing those less frequently used or are regularly damaged/vandalised.

The Play Sufficiency Duty requires local authorities to assess the sufficiency of play opportunities for children in their areas and requires local authorities to secure sufficient play opportunities for children in their areas, as far is reasonable and practical.

It is important that we understand the impact of the proposals before a final decision on the introduction of a rationalisation of play areas is taken. Your participation in this consultation will enable the council to measure the impact of these proposals on users and to balance this against the wider service needs of the community.

Grass cutting review

The council manages and maintains a range of different assets and green spaces. This includes formal parks (for example, Griffin Park, Maesteg Welfare Park), playing fields (for example, Newbridge Fields, Llangynwyd Playing Fields, Locks Lane), council owned open spaces in housing areas and grass on road verges.

Due to budget reductions, consideration is being given to reducing the frequency of grass cutting at these sites.

Proposal one: It is proposed that grass cutting in open spaces and road verges is reduced from 7 to 5 times per year.

Proposal two: It is proposed that grass cutting in parks (this includes parks, playing fields, incidental open spaces, housing areas, kick abouts, children's play areas) is reduced from 16 to 12 times per year.

Areas affected by this change will be highway verges, areas of on street grass and other open space grassed land such as those in children's play grounds and other less formal areas where the council currently cuts the grass.

These services are deemed in the main non statutory, meaning the council does not have to provide such services or facilities. There are some exceptions where there is a statutory duty where road safety is effected such as grassed highways vision splays.

It is important that we understand the impact of the proposals before a final decision on a reduction of grass cut areas and maintained parkland is taken. Your participation in this consultation will enable the council to gauge the impact of these proposals on members of the public and to balance this against the wider service needs of the community.

Potential increased charged for the use of sports fields, and sports pavilions

The council provides provision of public playing fields, outdoor sports facilities and parks pavilions ("sports facilities") that can be hired by sports clubs and members of the public for recreational purposes. During the recent budget consultation, 60% of the respondents supported an increase in charges.

A full list of council run playing fields, sports facilities and pavilions can be found here: <u>https://www.bridgend.gov.uk/residents/leisure-culture-and-libraries/parks-and-playing-fields/</u> The council provides and maintains pavilion buildings, playing fields, and bowling greens for outdoor sports that can be hired by sports clubs, individuals and groups for recreational and other purposes. In total the council currently provides:

- 40 football pitches
- 31 rugby pitches
- 9 cricket squares
- 17 bowling greens

These services are deemed non statutory, meaning the council does not have to provide these services or facilities but historically has done so on a heavily subsidised basis, covering on average up to 80% of costs. Unfortunately, continued and ongoing budget pressure means that the council are no longer able to deliver all services to the same level as previously provided. This may mean that charges to use Council Owned sports facilities are significantly increased, or the main users take over responsibility for their management.

The council is considering the introduction of full cost recovery charges from 1 April 2020 and stopping the annual bowls grant. This will give sports clubs and town and community councils an opportunity to consider and progress the self-management of such facilities under a community asset transfer in the form of a short-term renewable management agreements or long-term lease, thereby no longer paying user charges to the council if the facilities are transferred.

The council is aware that increasing charges could have a detrimental impact on users of its facilities. The council wishes to understand the views of the public and users of sports clubs. It is important that we understand the impact of the proposals before a final decision on the introduction of full cost recovery for sports facilities is taken.
